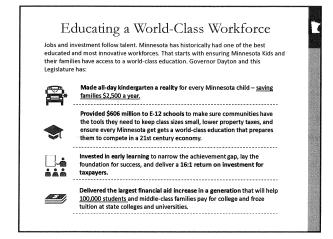




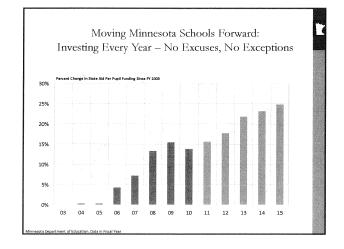


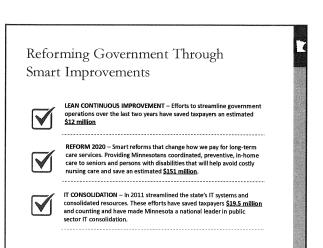


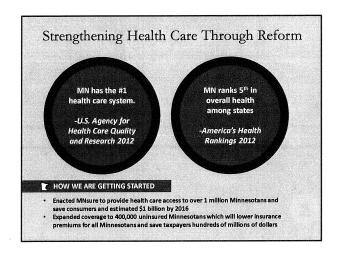


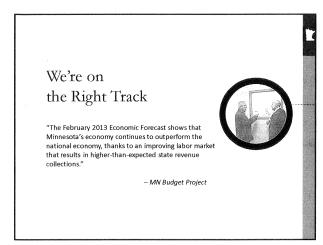


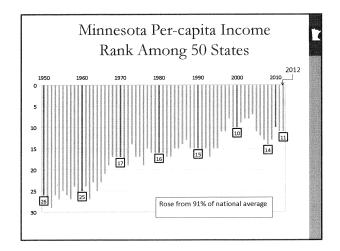


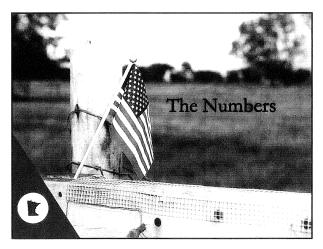


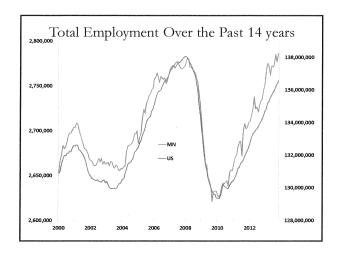


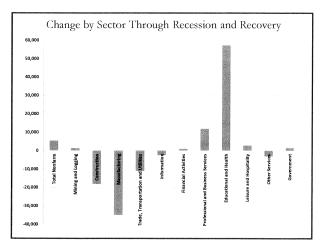


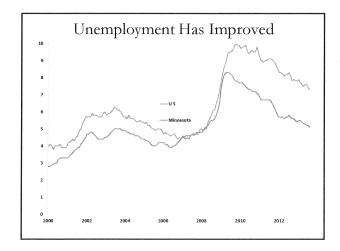


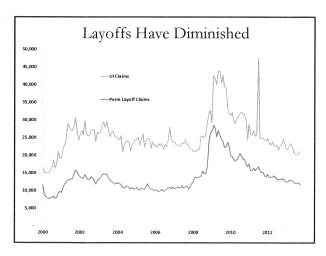


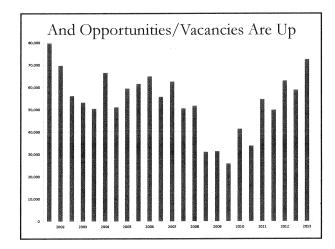








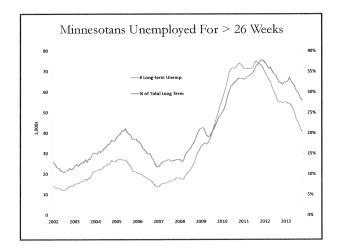


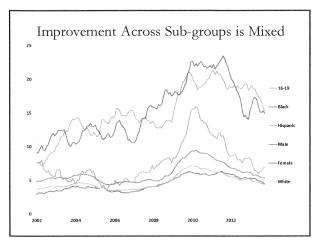


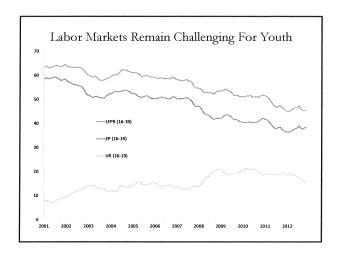
So Employment, Unemployment, Vacancies and Layoffs Are At (Or Near) Pre-Recessionary Levels

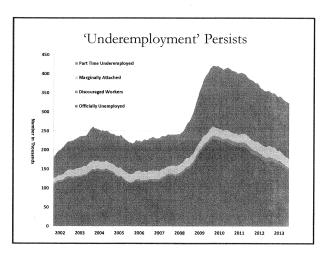
But Top-Level Numbers Conceal Some Persistent Underlying Concerns

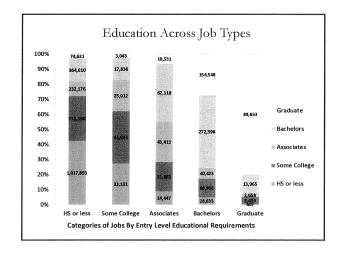

- Substantial Underemployment

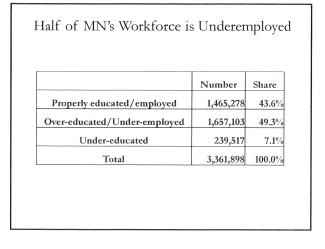












In Review
