of the Senate.

Messages from the Senate being under consideration,

On motion of Mr, Sanborn, the House concurred in the above concurrent resolution, and Messrs. Sanborn, Dunn and Stedjee were appointed a committee to act with the committee appointed by the Senate, to wait upon the Governor and inform him that the Senate and House are fully organized and ready to receive any communication His Excellency may be pleased to make.

Mr. Sanborn from the joint committee appointed to wait upon his excellency the Governor and inform him that the two houses of the Legislature are organized and ready to receive any communication he may have to make, reported that the committee had attended to the duty assigned, and that his excellency the Governor will make a communication to a joint convention of the two houses to convene on the 12th inst., at 11 o'clock, A. M.

Which report was adopted.
